COMMON SEED PROJECT

Inspired by Common Read projects, the Common Seed project involves a community of home gardeners all growing a common seed, and learning seed saving practices. The inaugural seed is the Provider green bean, known for being easy to grow, either in garden beds, raised beds, or containers. Provider beans can be planted 1-2 weeks before the last frost of spring, generally the 3rd or 4th week of May in Western Massachusetts.

Provider bean seed kits were available at the Information Services Desk the first week in May. Thirty were distributed!


Statistical Highlights (library usage):






























Staff News:
